





Here are some impressions of what we have been up to:

Our visit to Aberdeen Science Centre


Last week we enjoyed a workshop about Day and Night at Aberdeen Science Centre. It concluded the theme about Light and Darkness from our Science lessons over the past two terms. It also served as an introduction to our next Science subject: the Solar System. The children got to learn about different planets, particularly ours, in a fun and interactive way. Afterwards they got to explore the other areas of the centre including the Life Sciences, Engineering, Energy etc. What a fun way to learn new things!

































To go with the P1 & P2's farm theme in Literacy this term, they got to make their own butter.













In Social Sciences, with some overlap in our Biblical studies, we looked at Israel's Exodus from Egypt. The children made some unleavened bread which they got to enjoy with the homemade butter from the P1 & 2s!

This wasn't the only baking we did, as the children also got to bake some German biscuits (Plätzchen) to finish of the winter term the German way. The P5s even got to attempt the rather tricky *Vanillekipferl*.















In PE we continued dancing - but specifically considered line dances.

At the end of the term the children had to come up with their own choreography in pairs and present them to the rest of the class!
